

## **EVANGELISM & SOCIAL JUSTICE (PX) ~ OBJECTIVES, MEASUREMENTS & OUTCOMES 2022-2023**

The Evangelism & Social Justice (Praxis) major builds on the A.A. (Evangelism & Compassion) curriculum taking students beyond the experience of serving in evangelism and compassion ministries to leading such ministries independently in church and parachurch settings. Both programs use the head (knowing), heart (being), and hands (doing) method of disciple-making that Jesus modeled in the Scriptures.

Because there is a significant mentoring component in this degree, the program is designed to help students develop in their ministry skills and dispositions. Assessment of student progress is, in some ways, more subjective. Students who enrol in this program but are not open to the intense experiences and mentoring tend to transfer out early in the program, thus, those who complete the program have, in large measure, met the objectives. Transcript grades for successful completion of these experiences is based not on only participation in the various ministries, but also in students' abilities to provide leadership to these ministries

### **OBJECTIVE 1 – Praxis major students will understand spiritual and social issues present in the world, and be able to address them from a Biblical perspective**

The course of study for this major begins with an examination of the biblical roots of compassion ministry, as well as historical and current models of such ministries. Students also study social justice from a biblical perspective, considering the corporate and individual Christian responsibility to address such issues. Although the topics for consideration change based on current issues, sometimes from year to year, the principles addressed remain consistent.

**Benchmark 1: 75% of PX major students will earn a grade of at least 80% (B-) in assignments which relate to an understanding of current issues<sup>1</sup>**

**Benchmark 2: 75% of PX major students will earn a grade of at least 80% (B-) in assignments which relate to their engagement with and reflection on current issues<sup>2</sup>**

### **OBJECTIVE 2 – Praxis major students will have first-hand experience of evangelistic and compassionate outreach work in a wide variety of environments outside of traditional church settings<sup>3</sup>**

In addition to a core of general education and Bible/theology courses, students participate in a wide range of hands-on social ministries, which are graduated in nature and expectations, as students develop in their ministry skills and dispositions. In the first year of Praxis students spend approximately 50 hours per semester sharing their faith in various outreach settings through word and deed, receiving coaching,

feedback, and evaluation from their professor/Program Director. Full engagement with this is measured through their grade in Regional Praxis I and II (PX 115 and PX 117). In year two they do the same thing in two week-long intensives, one in an urban setting in North America and the other in an international cross-cultural setting. Students answer a series of reflective questions and assign themselves a grade. The final grade in Urban Praxis (PX 250) and Cross-Cultural Praxis (PX 251) is assigned by the professor/Program Director.

**Benchmark: 90% of PX major students will earn a grade of at least 80% (B-) in practical ministry components<sup>4</sup>**

**OBJECTIVE 3 – Praxis major students will have an in-depth understanding of at least one compassion or social justice issue and ministry to those dealing with this issue**

In their third year, BAM PX students focus on one aspect of compassion or social justice ministry through Directed Praxis (PX 350), building on experiences in Regional Praxis in the first year of the program. Because of the regular, sustained engagement, students get a closer look at how the ministry functions as well as the hands-on engagement with the ministry. In the Praxis Senior Project (PX 400) students study an area of interest within the realm of evangelism, compassion, or social justice ministry. Here they seek to understand the roots and nature of the issue as well as ministry to those impacted by it.

**Benchmark: 75% of PX major students will earn a grade of at least 80% (B-) in in-depth ministry focus assignments**

**OBJECTIVE 4 – Praxis major students will be equipped to work in organizations and churches already focused on compassion and social justice, as well as to establish and lead evangelistic and compassion outreach ministries**

In the third or fourth year, students assume a leadership role among first-year students enrolled in Regional Praxis I and II, assisting the Program Director in planning, leading, and reflecting on the ministry experience with first-year students. This gives them an insight into the logistics of leading such ministries, including mentoring younger students, while continuing to be mentored by the PX Program Director. Like all B.A. Ministry students, students enrolled in the Praxis major complete an Supervised Ministry Experience (internship) in a church or ministry where they can gain first-hand experience in planning and leading evangelism, compassion, and social justice ministries.

**CONCLUSION / ACTION STEPS**

The data addressed in this report comes from the “COVID-19 years,” each influenced by the pandemic and accompanying health and safety regulations in different ways. While this cannot be used as an excuse, it was a contributing factor to the overall student learning experience. Although 2022-2023 was a more ‘normal’ years, at Kingswood, the impact of COVID-19 was by no means over. Canadian border restrictions were not fully removed until October 2022 and some ministry sites only re-opened during the 2022-2023 year. Further, it should be noted that lower enrolment in programs and courses means that one student failing to meet a benchmark can significantly impact the percentage of students meeting a target. For this reason, the analysis of data looks at trends more than minute fluctuations.

There is no doubt that among Kingswood programs, the Praxis programs suffered the most due to COVID-19 restrictions. This program includes weekly ministry trips to sites such as those listed in Note 3. Most of these ministries were closed and/or not open to additional volunteers in the 2020-2021 year; some re-opened in 2021-2022, and others not until 2022-2023. This has certainly affected enrolment; it was disheartening to be enrolled in a practical program when many of the experiences had to be cancelled. With an increased return to ‘normal,’ there are indications that this program will recover.

There are two Praxis programs at Kingswood University, namely the two-year A.A. degree, and the major within the B.A. Ministry degree. While students take many of the same courses in the first years, the outcomes are different. In areas where the B.A. students appear to have struggled (e.g. Objective 1, Benchmark 1, related to understanding of current issues), A.A. students appear to have excelled.

- Because there is significant overlap between the two programs, assessing the two programs as a whole may be a better path.
- This program is scheduled for a regular curriculum review in 2024-2025, with the input of a new Program Director (started fall 2023).
