

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COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

1. How to Read the Bible (Dr. Dave Smith)

Want to take your engagement with Scripture to the next level? This course will teach you some basic tools to read Scripture in context, bathed in prayer for the help of the Spirit. You will be exposed to the process of observing, interpreting, and applying the Bible to your life, the church, and the world today. The beginning of your journey with reading the Bible in context begins here.

2. A Brief Guide to the Old Testament (Dr. Steve Lennox)

Curious about the Old Testament? These five lessons give you an overview of the Old Testament from Genesis to Malachi. You will learn about its sections and how they connect and get a sense of what each of its 39 books is about. Finally, you will briefly explore the Old Testament's central themes, figures, and events.

3. A Brief Guide to the New Testament (Dr. Abson Joseph)

In this course you will get a basic overview of the New Testament from Matthew to Revelation. You will learn about its sections and how they connect and get a sense of what each of its 27 books is about. Finally, you will briefly explore the New Testament's major themes, figures, and events.

4. Basic Christian Beliefs (Dr. Chris Bounds)

Theology is the language of God. In this course, you will be introduced to the core teachings and principles of the Christian faith. You will learn about God as the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit. You will explore creation, the fall, redemption, and the hope to come.

5. Understanding Holiness (Dr. Steve Deneff)

Holiness for us as humans is nothing other than being wholly the humans God made us to be. In this course, you will explore questions such as, "What did it look like for Jesus to be fully human?", "What does the empowered image of God look like in those filled with the Spirit?", and "What would the Church look like if it functioned with God's design?" Join us in this quest to discover what God intended for humanity at creation and continues to intend for us today.

6. A Brief Guide to Church History (Dr. Bud Bence)

In this course, you will get a look at five key moments in the story of the Church from its birth to present day. Catch a glimpse of how God has walked with his people for the last two thousand years as we await the return of Christ. Through this course, you will explore how God has worked in the past as well as how we ourselves are a part of the Church's story today.

7. **Sharing Your Faith** (Dr. Jim Lo)

In this course, you will learn how to share your faith effectively through personal testimony and the plan of salvation. We will explore the importance of building a relationship with God through prayer, worship, and reading the Bible, as well as studying the four steps to accepting Jesus Christ as Saviour. In this course, we will also cover the elements necessary for effectively sharing a testimony. By the end of the course, you will have the tools and knowledge to confidently share your faith with others.

8. Discipling at Work (Dr. David Drury)

In this course, you will gain guidance on how to be a catalyst for discipleship in a workplace environment. You will learn the practical ways you can demonstrate and integrate Christ-like values into everyday professional interactions with a caring attitude and exemplary ethical conduct. In addition, you will be equipped with strategies to be a disciple-maker with fellow believers at work and a witness to non-believers both implicitly and, as God opens the doors, explicitly.

If you are an emerging leader, team manager, or someone keen on enhancing their leadership prowess in a constantly evolving landscape, this course is for you.

13. Sound, Lighting, and Visual Basics (TBD)

In this hands-on course, you will gain the skills to improve technical production quality for your church. We will explore the foundational elements of sound, lighting, and visuals, providing practical knowledge and technical skills that enhance the experience. By focusing on the unique needs and challenges of a church setting, you will learn how to create an engaging and immersive environment for your congregation.

14. Graphic Design Fundamentals (TBD)

This course seeks to unlock your creative potential for graphic design with a focus on how to apply this in a Christian setting. Looking at both the theoretical and the practical, you will get a taste of basic design principles, color theory, typography, and key software tools. As you navigate this course, you will build a foundation in graphic design that will help you create visual narratives to engage your potential viewers.

15. Video Editing Fundamentals (TBD)

In this course, you will explore the art and technique of video editing. You will be equipped with essential skills in crafting compelling video narratives. Whether your aim is to share stories from Scripture, create church event highlights, or produce worship music videos, this course provides a solid foundation in video editing, blending both technical prowess and aesthetics.

16. **Developing a Social Media Strategy** (Rev. Tanya Nace)

In this course, you will learn how to effectively use social media to engage your church community online. We will explore various social media platforms and learn how to create engaging content that will reach new members and deepen connections with existing ones. You will also learn how to create a simple social media strategy that aligns with your church's mission and values. By the end of this course, you will have an understanding of how to begin building a strong online presence for your church.

You will also deepen your understanding of God's view of wealth and the importance of financial responsibility.

We will explore vital areas such as communication, conflict resolution, and spiritual unity, drawing from biblical teachings and contemporary counseling techniques. You will acquire tools and knowledge to effectively support couples in building a solid foundation for a lifelong partnership centered in faith and mutual understanding.

Buckingham) In this course, you will learn how to let go of the bondage of insecurity in leadership and lead in the freedom that comes from believing that any situation can be turned around given enough time and the right type of leadership. Learn how to take responsibility for situations and gain the confidence to find solutions to any problem.

You will also be introduced to the tools and techniques used to analyze the internal and external environment of an organization.

You will explore critical communication components such as active listening, effective feedback, non-verbal communication, public speaking, and conflict resolution, with a focus on practical application in diverse leadership contexts.

25. **Developing Your People** (Rev. Ethan Linder)

This course offers guidance for church leaders and mentors focused on fostering individual and organizational growth within their congregations. The course covers strategic development, including recognizing and nurturing individual talents and competencies, and extends to broader organizational development themes such as delegation, development culture, and the dynamics of sending and celebrating growth. Participants will learn about equipping individuals for personal and spiritual growth and building a thriving, sustainable developmental culture within their organizations. The course offers practical strategies for identifying potential leaders, managing transitions, and maintaining a curious and flexible approach to organizational and personal development.

26. Finding Balance in a Busy Life (Dr. Anita Eastlack)

In this course, you will learn how to navigate the challenges of a busy life while maintaining a sense of harmony and spiritual well-being. In this course, you will gain practical tools, biblical principles, and spiritual guidance to help you discover strategies for prioritization, time management, self-care, and cultivating a deeper relationship with God amidst the demands of everyday life.

27. Crisis Management for Church Leaders (John Lyon)

This course equips you, as a pastor or Christian leader, with the tools and understanding necessary to navigate crises effectively. We will explore a biblical perspective on crisis management and learn how to apply this wisdom to various crisis scenarios that may occur within a church or other setting. In this course, we focus on the nuts and bolts of crisis response and giving helpful guidance on what concrete steps to take and avoid when a crisis hits.

28. What the Bible Says About Work (Dr. Steve Lennox)

In this course, you will be guided on an exploration of the concept of work as found in the Bible, analyzing its ethical dimensions and inherent purpose, and presenting suggestions on maintaining a healthy balance. You will explore the Scriptures and find important truths about the value and purpose of work. In the process, you will develop an enriched understanding of the spiritual principles that should guide professional life.

29. Fighting Addiction (Rev. Billy Robel)

In this course, you will learn how to fight the battle against addiction. You will learn the steps that lead to finding lasting freedom as well as learning how to identify and address behaviors that have led down the road of bondage. You will also learn how Jesus Christ can bring transformation to your life through daily dependence on Him. This class will help you to rebuild your foundation using a variety of tools found throughout scripture.

30. Thriving Together: Supporting the Mental Health of Others (Dr. Allen Lee) In this course, you will gain basic principles behind effective mental health support. While serious matters of mental and emotional well-being should be referred to a professional, there are some basic skills that anyone can put into action—skills like listening, encouraging, and empathizing. Everyone's well-being would increase if we all put these biblical values into practice. This course is great for non-professionals who wish to play a supportive role in improving the mental health of their family, friends, or broader community.

You will discover a holistic perspective on personhood in which the body plays an integral rather than marginal role. Beginning with the concept of the *imago Dei*, you will see the importance of Sabbath and fellowship. You will reflect on the wonder of our God-given bodies and celebrate the gift of human sexuality, exploring a biblical understanding of God's design.

32. **Apologetics** (Dr. Adam Blehm)

You will learn the classical arguments for God and Christianity as well as historical answers to questions about suffering and evil. We will also emphasize the importance of the Holy Spirit in drawing us to God and how our character can have an even greater impact on others than our knowledge. By the end of the course, you will be equipped to discuss your faith with doubters, seekers, and believers wanting to go deeper in their faith.

33. Figuring out Your Calling (Rev. Zach Coffin)

Drawing on scriptural examples and self-reflection, you will engage in a process of spiritual, personal, and practical discernment, bathed in prayer and engaging the wisdom of others. This course aims to equip you with tools to navigate life's crossroads with faith that God is with you every step of the way.

You will develop a holistic understanding of how these practices can be applied in your own life and the life of the church today.
